Cosmetology/Spa and Esthetics

> Early Childhood Education

> Math

- Mrs. Holbrook has implemented Modeling Mondays in Geometry where the class looks at examples from the Ohio End-of-Course exam and works through them.
- Integrated 3 students are learning about polynomial functions and recently completed a parabola unit. Students had to make connections to parabolas in the real world.

> Science

- Anatomy students have been studying the brain. Next week they will dissect sheep brains.
- Environmental students have been learning about different aquatic biomes and have created eco columns which they maintain daily to keep the mosquito fish alive and to collect data on the soil, water pH, and nitrate levels.



- Material Science students are studying metals and more specifically, corrosion. They are completing a lab comparing various metals and the time it takes to corrode in different solutions.
- Biology students finished up a section on cellular transport.
- Chemistry is finishing their study of atoms and the periodic table.

- > The State Highway Patrol performed annual spot inspections on our four school buses. No violations were found.
- > We assisted Air Handling Equipment with the annual service of our large air compressor.
- > We assisted Armor Fire with the fourth quarter sprinkler inspections. No issues were found.
- ➤ We assisted Northwest Security with the annual fire alarm system test. A bad DVC in the Adult Ed. entrance panel was found. Parts are on order to replace it.
- ➤ We have been having issues with the dust collector not starting up automatically in the H.S. welding lab. Robovent helped diagnose the problem and they made a few small adjustments which have helped, but they feel we will need to make some upgrades in the near future because technology in the unit is no longer supported.
- > Two new custodians have been hired Steve Burrow and Cory Hartzog. They are both doing very well and I think they will be great assets to our team.
- ➤ In December and January, we completed 44 preventative maintenance tasks and 87 work requests.

- ➤ I am settling into my new role as IT Manager. I want to thank the other administrators for their support.
- > We performed server updates and reboots, installed security cameras, and completed Windows updates over Christmas break.
- ➤ The migration to Google Mail (Gmail) is complete and this conversion will bolster cyber security readiness.
- ➤ We worked with a cyber readiness company to hold a phishing e-mail test for staff. Only 2 staff members clicked on the link.
- ➤ We supported multiple video wall events including Adult Ed LPN graduation, 411Blast, and Zoom meetings.
- ➤ The VEC was configured and 3 new Cisco network switches were installed in the Lowry Building. Six switches were condensed to 3 switches.
- ➤ Homeland Technologies Group tested and configured 7 Halo vape sensors. They had not been working correctly since installed.
- ➤ We prepped devices (Windows desktop, laptop and an iMac) that were auctioned at the All Area Boards Dinner: .
- ➤ Matt Kinzer stabilized the Avigilon security system by changing settings so the cameras didn't pixelate.
- Schoolhouse Electronics replaced the whiteboard in a classroom due to touch issues and they also fixed HDMI projector issues.
- ➤ Technology Services completed 253 Help Desk trouble tickets during the months of December and January.
