- Assisted McBride Brother's Painting in repainting 15 different rooms in the NE section of the Academic wing and the 200 hallways.
- Replaced the hands-free faucets in both high school nursing labs with manually operated faucets to replicate what they use when taking their clinical tests.
- A large portion of the summer was spent swapping the HVAC and Police Academy labs. In the new HVAC lab we leveled out the concrete, built a tool crib, ran gas line, and installed a central exhaust system for the instructional stations.
- > We moved 50 lockers from the Carpentry lab to the mezzanine in the CET lab.
- In preparation for the new metal shear in the Welding lab, we extended the dust collector ductwork, installed new flexible arms over the flame cutting table, and wired in the shear once it arrived.
- I applied for and received an HVAC grant, through the BWC, for \$12,279 dollars to have 3 airflow stations replaced on AHU-D101.
- Summer cleaning was completed on schedule this year. I would like to thank our custodians for all their hard work this summer making Apollo clean and welcoming to all of our students and staff.

- > We completed 24 preventative maintenance tasks and 92 maintenance work requests in August.
